There are over 50 of my steam rally clips uploaded and the rest of them amount to 100,000 views compared to Shrewsbury 2017 Rally which is closing in on 600,000! Of the rest only Graham Lee's steam shovel at Beamish has exceeded 10,000 and less than half have reached 1000 views.

I freely confess that I originally expected the LBLR clips to elicit as much interest as the steam rallies. Indeed that was roughly the case until Sid turned up on the scene, at which point the total views were almost 10,000. They now total over 600,000, with just 4 clips accounting for 93.4% of views.
